.04 **WHEREAS**, The Senate Leadership Council Committee shall be responsible for assisting the Legislative

.05 Assistant with the Senate Leadership Council interview process, the Senate Leadership Council selection

.06 process, and any other tasks deemed necessary by the Legislative Assistant; and

.07 **WHEREAS**, The Senate Leadership Council Committee shall adhere with Senate Rule 9: Senate Leadership

.08 Council;

.10 **THEREFORE, BE IT**

.11 **RESOLVED**, That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida creates an ad-hoc

.12 committee named the Senate Leadership Council (SLC) Ad-Hoc Committee;

.13 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the Legislative Assistant, as appointed by the Speaker of the Senate, act

.14 as the Chair of the Senate Leadership Council Committee;

.15 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the committee consist of nine (9) senators elected by a majority vote of

.16 the Student Senate, a President Pro Tempore Representative, and the Legislative Assistant;

.17 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That membership of the Senate Leadership Council be open to all University

.18 of Central Florida students;

.19 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the Senate Leadership Council Ad-Hoc Committee set its own procedure

.20 and standards for the selection process;

.21 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the Senate Leadership Council complete the interview and selection

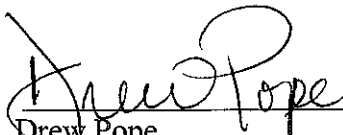

[Resolution Supporting Alternate Parking Methods by the Academic Village Intramural Fields]

.01 **WHEREAS**, The Student Government Association is the official governing body of the students of the University of
 .02 Central Florida (UCF) and exists to represent the students' best interests;
 .03 **WHEREAS**, Parking is an issue that students all over campus face every day at UCF;
 .04 **WHEREAS**, The Academic Village (AV) parking lot provides spaces for students who reside in Nike and Hercules
 .05 housing as well as for students visiting the Recreation and Wellness Center (RWC) intramural fields;
 .06 **WHEREAS**, Intramural sports, the Marching Band, and club sports all have to share approximately 160 parking spaces;
 .07 **WHEREAS**, The closest general student parking beyond the spaces near the Intramural Fields is located by the Barbra
 .08 Ying Center;
 .09 **WHEREAS**, There are plans to expand housing in Academic Village, which will only create the need for more parking
 .10 spaces;
 .11 **WHEREAS**, Since the expansion of the RWC intramural fields, there has been an increase of approximately 40 parking
 .12 spaces in the area;
 .13 **WHEREAS**, Parking in the Academic Village/Intramural Field lot during peak hours of the day is nearly impossible when
 .14 multiple activities are taking place simultaneously in the same location; and
 .15 **WHEREAS**, The issue of parking specifically in the area of the Academic Village/Intramural Fields requires further
 .16 investigation in order to curb the parking situation in the vicinity;
 .17
 .18 **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida supports
 .19 an exploration into supplementary parking for the Academic Village/Intramural Fields area;
 .20 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida advocates that
 .21 the university look into the idea of creating a parking garage by the Academic Village/Intramural Fields in an effort to add
 .22 more accessibility for students utilizing the intramural fields for athletics and additional extracurricular activities, as well
 .23 as to add another parking venue for general student parking;
 .24 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida strongly urges
 .25 parking services to cease ticketing students who are parked immediately outside the Academic Village/Intramural Field
 .26 area between 4:00pm and 10:00pm, Monday through Friday;
 .27 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida encourages
 .28 parking services to create an overflow lot near the intramural fields, to allow for more general student parking;
 .29 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida asks for
 .30 clearer labeling of the parking areas near the Academic Village/Intramural Fields to prevent confusion between general
 .31 student parking and Academic Village parking; and
 .32 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That copies of this resolution be sent to Mr. William Merck, Vice President for
 .33 Administration and Finance; Dr. Maribeth Ehasz, Vice President for Student Development & Enrollment Services; Mr.
 .34 Krishna Singh, Director of Parking Services; and Mr. James Wilkening, Director of the Recreation & Wellness Center.

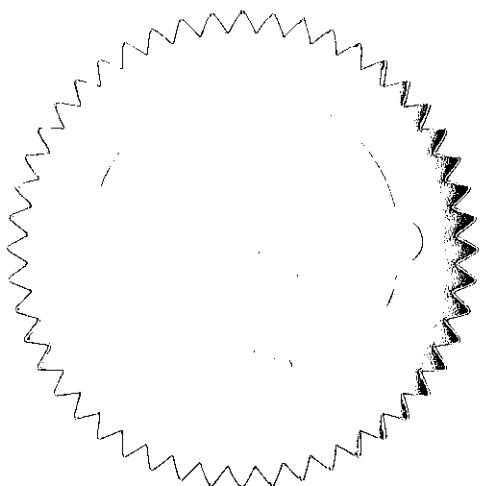

.01 **WHEREAS**, Title VIII: The Finance Code states that the Conference Registration and Travel (CRT) Committee
 .02 must introduce legislation establishing the current year's Registration and Travel account Spending Policy of the
 .03 newly elected Senate;
 .04 **WHEREAS**, The CRT Committee has reviewed prior Spending Policies; and
 .05 **WHEREAS**, The CRT Committee feels that it is in the best interest of the student body to continue this statute-
 .06 mandate requirement;

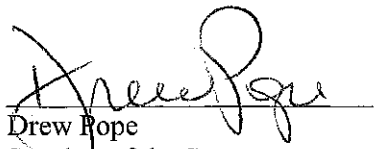

.09 **Resolved**, By the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida that the following policies be
 .10 established for use of the Registration and Travel account by the CRT Committee and the Senate:

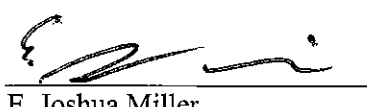
- .11 1. Allocation requests must be time-stamped and received by the CRT Chair prior to the start of the CRT
- .12 meeting for them to be considered.
- .13 2. Allocation requests must be heard by the CRT Committee at least fourteen days before funding is
- .14 needed.
- .15 3. If an organization is requesting funding, an authorized officer of the organization must be present at the
- .16 CRT Committee, Caucus, or Senate meeting to be considered.
- .17 4. Regional Campus, Rosen, and Medical School students may be present via teleconference and/or video
- .18 conference.
- .19 5. Individuals must be present to present their allocation. If said individual cannot make CRT committee
- .20 meeting, CRT Caucus, or Senate meeting due to extenuating circumstances; said student may be present
- .21 via teleconference and/or video conference.
- .22 6. Internships, study abroad trips, retreats, service trips and similar trips at the discretion of the CRT
- .23 Committee will not be eligible to receive funding from CRT.
- .24 7. The Registration and Travel account will not be used to fund costs outside the realms of registration,
- .25 lodging, and primary mode of transportation.

.27 **Be it Further Resolved**, that to break this policy, it will take a two-thirds vote of the CRT Committee or the Student
 .28 Senate.

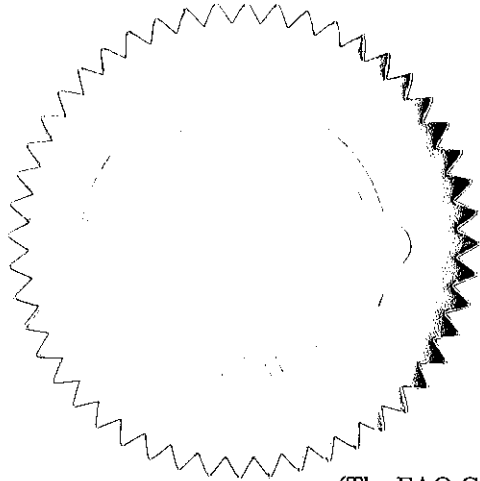

 .11 1. Allocation requests must be time-stamped and received by the FAO chair prior to the start of the
 .12 next regularly scheduled meeting.
 .13 2. Allocation requests must be heard by the FAO Committee at least four school weeks before funding
 .14 is needed.
 .15 3. If an organization is requesting funding, an authorized officer of the organization must be present at
 .16 the FAO committee meeting, caucus, or Senate meeting to be considered. Regional campus, Rosen,
 .17 and Medical School students may be present via teleconference and/or video conference.
 .18 4. If an organization is requesting funding for food, refreshments, or decorations, quotes must be
 .19 provided to the FAO committee.
 .20 5. The Senate Working Fund will not be used to fund decorations, unless being used for the purpose of
 .21 cultural, ethnic, or religious education at the discretion of the FAO committee.
 .22 6. The Senate Working Fund will not be used to fund food or refreshments, unless being served for the
 .23 purpose of cultural, ethnic, or religious education at the discretion of the FAO committee.
 .24 7. The Senate Working Fund will not be used to fund the costs for shirts or awards/trophies.
 .25 8. The Senate Working Fund will not be used to fund award ceremonies or banquets at the discretion of
 .26 the FAO committee.

.28 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that to break this policy, it will require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the FAO
 .29 Committee or the Student Body Senate.

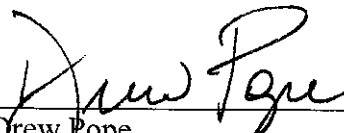

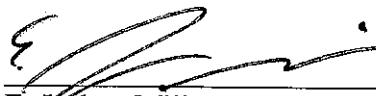
- .01 **WHEREAS,** The University of Central Florida cherishes every student who has been a part of the UCF

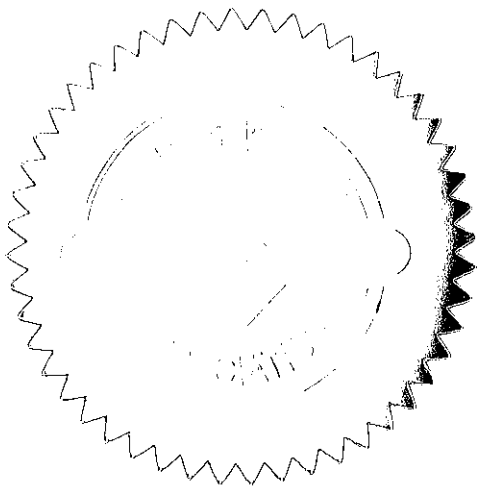

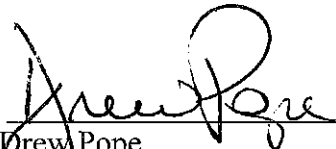

 .20 the excuse)

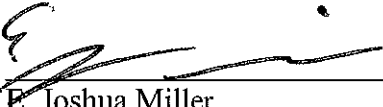

.01 **WHEREAS**, The Student Government Association is the governing body of the students of the University of
 .02 Central Florida and exists to represent the students’ best interests;
 .03 **WHEREAS**, The Big East Conference has been in talks to expand the conference in a variety of sports;
 .04 **WHEREAS**, One of the members of the Big East Conference is the University of Central Florida’s rival, the
 .05 University of South Florida;
 .06 **WHEREAS**, The University of Central Florida is the second largest university in the country, with more than
 .07 56,000 students;
 .08 **WHEREAS**, According to Nielsen market rankings, the city of Orlando is 19th on the list of top television
 .09 markets in the country for the 2010-2011 TV season;
 .10 **WHEREAS**, The University of Central Florida has been bowl eligible for four out of the six football seasons
 .11 played in Conference USA;
 .12 **WHEREAS**, University of Central Florida athletic teams have competed in the Conference USA championship
 .13 tournaments in each sport and have won those championships in sports such as football, women’s basketball, and
 .14 softball;
 .15 **WHEREAS**, The University of Central Florida has state-of-the-art athletic facilities, including Nicholson
 .16 Fieldhouse, the only indoor athletic practice facility in the state of Florida; and
 .17 **WHEREAS**, The University of Central Florida’s athletic program has beaten teams from the larger athletic
 .18 conferences, including the Southeastern Conference and the Atlantic Coast Conference, in the sports in which
 .19 they participate;

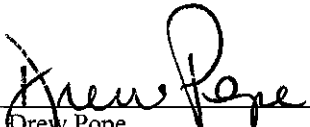

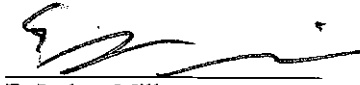

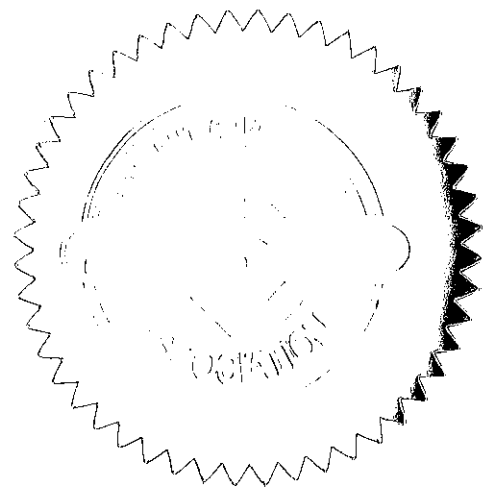
[Resolution Against Establishing Flat Rate Tuition at the University of Central Florida]

.01 **WHEREAS,** The Student Government Association is the official governing body of the students of the University of Central
.02 Florida and exists to represent the students' best interests;
.03 **WHEREAS,** The current flat rate tuition option allowed by the Florida Board of Governors would allow any state university to
.04 charge full-time students a standard tuition which does not take into account the amount of credit hours taken by each
.05 individual student;
.06 **WHEREAS,** The average full-time student at the University of Central Florida takes of 12 credit hours per semester, according
.07 to statistics provided by the University of Central Florida Office of Institutional Research;
.08 **WHEREAS,** The block tuition proposal accepted by the Florida Board of Governors and under consideration by the University
.09 of Florida seeks to establish a flat rate tuition at 15 credit hours per semester;
.10 **WHEREAS,** The administration of the University of Florida has stated support for instituting flat rate tuition at that institution;
.11 **WHEREAS,** The student senate of the University of Florida has passed a resolution in opposition to flat rate tuition;
.12 **WHEREAS,** Student groups such as Students for a Democratic Society and campus media organizations such as the
.13 Independent Florida Alligator have voiced opposition to the proposed plan at the University of Florida; and
.14 **WHEREAS,** University of Central Florida Student Government President Michael Kilbride has issued a statement in
.15 opposition to the imposition of flat rate tuition;
.16
.17 **THEREFORE, BE IT**
.18 **RESOLVED,** That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida opposes the imposition of a flat tuition
.19 rate for full-time students;
.20 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida opposes the
.21 imposition of a flat tuition rate at any institution within the Florida state university system;
.22 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida stands in solidarity
.23 with any student body in the state of Florida that opposes the imposition of flat rate tuition at their university;
.24 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** It is the opinion of the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida that
.25 students should be required to only pay for the courses that they elect to take;
.26 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** It is the opinion of the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida that
.27 students have the right to determine what course load is optimal to their own specific learning ability so that they may derive
.28 satisfactory academic benefit from their courses;
.29 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** It is the opinion of the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida that
.30 the imposition of a flat rate tuition unduly affects students with financial restraints, causing them to be placed under increased
.31 pressure to maintain the qualifications needed to maintain scholarships and employment necessary for continued enrollment;
.32 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** It is the opinion of the Forty-Third Student Senate of the University of Central Florida that,
.33 given concerns over the rising drop-out rate amongst college students, increased concern should be placed on students being
.34 able to successfully finish their courses rather than on how quickly they are capable of doing so; and
.35 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That copies of this resolution be sent to the Board of Trustees at the University of Central
.36 Florida, the Board of Trustees at the University of Florida, Florida Board of Governors, University of Central Florida Provost
.37 Tony Waldrop, and the Independent Florida Alligator.

 the Sergeant-at-Arms' Responsibilities]

.01 **WHEREAS**, Senate Rules require constant updates in order to meet the current needs of the Student
 .02 Senate;
 .03 **WHEREAS**, Rule 3: Decorum and Debate on the Senate Floor contains the Sergeant-at-Arms'
 .04 responsibilities;
 .05 **WHEREAS**, The Sergeant-at-Arms' responsibilities currently contradict Title II: Student Government
 .06 Statutory Definitions and Parliamentary Authority;
 .07 **WHEREAS**, Current Rule 3.05 B reads that the Sergeant-at-Arms is responsible for "removing any
 .08 disruptive individual, deemed by a majority vote of the Senate, from the Senate Meeting;"
 .09 **WHEREAS**, Removing an individual from a Senate Meeting is a restriction of power and therefore
 .10 should be confirmed by a 2/3 vote; and
 .11 **WHEREAS**, This resolution seeks to update Rule 3: Decorum and Debate on the Senate Floor by
 .12 modifying a majority vote to a 2/3 vote;

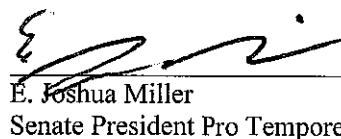
[Resolution Congratulating the UCF Knights Football Team on Winning the 2010 Conference USA Title and 2010 Liberty Bowl Game]

 .03 **WHEREAS**, According to the UCF Office of Institutional Research, the College currently has 7,821 undergraduate and
 .04 908 graduate students, for an overall enrollment of 8,729 students;
 .05 **WHEREAS**, The CBA Testing Center administers approximately 68,000 exams per semester;
 .06 **WHEREAS**, The CBA Testing Center has 164 computer stations and is used for CBA exams only;
 .07 **WHEREAS**, The CBA is currently working to increase the number of computer stations by 30;
 .08 **WHEREAS**, The CBA Testing Center has been featured in the New York Times article "To Stop Cheats, Colleges Learn
 .09 Their Trickery," in which CBA Associate Dean Taylor Ellis stated that "cheating has dropped significantly, to 14
 .10 suspected incidents out of 64,000 exams administered during the Spring 2010 Semester;"
 .11 **WHEREAS**, The CBA Testing Lab was designed to have the ability to be open 24 hours per week;
 .12 **WHEREAS**, The CBA Testing Lab's current hours of operation are Monday through Thursday, 7am-Midnight, Friday
 .13 7am-9:30pm, and Saturday 9:30am-8:30pm;
 .14 **WHEREAS**, The CBA has seen a significant increase in the usage of the CBA Testing Lab by CBA faculty;
 .15 **WHEREAS**, The CBA has had an extension in Testing Lab hours in previous semesters;
 .16 **WHEREAS**, The CBA is working with faculty to encourage students to take their exams earlier versus waiting until the
 .17 final day the exam is open;

.05 **WHEREAS**, The Spring Presidential Election runs from Monday, March 28, 2011, through Wednesday, March 30, 2011;
.06 **WHEREAS**, The 2011 Eternal Knights Memorial Service, which honors students who have passed away during recent
.07 academic terms, will be held on Wednesday, March 30, from 3:00pm – 4:30pm in the UCF Student Union;
.08 **WHEREAS**, This ceremony enables families and friends to join with campus leaders and members of the University of
.09 Central Florida community in a solemn tribute to their loved ones;
.10 **WHEREAS**, In order to allow families and friends to honor their loved ones quietly and without incident, it is imperative
.11 that active solicitation for votes cease around the proximity of the UCF Student Union several hours prior to the Eternal
.12 Knights Memorial Service due to families and guests arriving at the University of Central Florida; and
.13 **WHEREAS**, Campaigning will still be allowed throughout the main campus, but certain areas around the Student Union

 .05 **WHEREAS**, The presence of LGBT faculty and staff impacts students by providing positive role models and resources;
 .06 **WHEREAS**, Many UCF faculty and staff members have built strong, lasting, and loving same-sex relationships;
 .07 **WHEREAS**, These relationships are unrecognized by state and federal law as well as UCF policy, thus denying them many of the same rights
 .08 and privileges as opposite-sex couples;
 .09 **WHEREAS**, Employers compensate employees through more than just wages by providing additional benefits;
 .10 **WHEREAS**, Domestic partnership benefits for LGBT employees are available at many institutions of higher education in the State of Florida,
 .11 including the University of Florida, University of South Florida, Florida International University, University of North Florida, Brevard
 .12 Community College, Broward College, Central Florida Community College, Florida Keys Community College, Hillsborough Community
 .13 College, Lake-Sumter Community College, Manatee Community College, Miami-Dade College, Okaloosa-Walton College, Palm Beach State
 .14 College, Pasco-Hernando Community College, Santa Fe Community College, and Seminole Community College;
 .15 **WHEREAS**, Nationally, more than 300 institutions of higher education offer domestic partnership benefits to LGBT employees;
 .16 **WHEREAS**, 293 Fortune 500 Companies offer domestic partnership benefits to their LGBT employees;
 .17 **WHEREAS**, Many of the largest employers in the Orlando Metropolitan Area, such as Walt Disney World Resort, Darden Restaurants, Inc., and
 .18 Lockheed Martin recognize the economic and social value of extending domestic partnership benefits to their LGBT employees;
 .19 **WHEREAS**, Numerous municipalities in the State of Florida, including Orlando, Kissimmee, Gainesville, Tallahassee, Key West, Sarasota, the
 .20 City of Tampa, Miami-Dade County, Broward County, Palm Beach County, Monroe County, and Alachua County offer domestic partnership
 .21 benefits to LGBT couples;
 .22 **WHEREAS**, The absence of domestic partnership benefits for LGBT employees directly harms UCF students by undermining the recruitment
